
PREFACE.

THE Plates in this volume, a hundred and twenty-three in number, contain facsimiles of a hundred and thirty-two documents selected from those of which descriptions and transcripts are given in the second volume of *Greek Papyri in the British Museum*. They are arranged in chronological order, and include ten documents of the Ptolemaic period, ninety-one of the Roman, twenty-seven of the early Byzantine (fourth century), and three of the late Byzantine. Since the first volume of facsimiles contained a large preponderance of Ptolemaic and late Byzantine papyri, the two volumes together furnish a comprehensive representation of Greek writing upon papyrus (chiefly of the non-literary type) from the third century B.C. to the eighth century of the Christian era.

A numerical Table is prefixed to the Plates, to facilitate reference.








