In another part of this issue of the SOUTHERN WORKER we publish gle for Negro Rights that rips the hypocritical masks off the faces of the liberal gang who recently published a statement purporting to deal with lyaching to the South. It is an indictment that should be spread throughout the autice South as it will expose to the Negro and white workers precisely what a fifthy role these people play who pretend to consisten lyucking in words but who is reality defend the institution of lyucking-legal

ord occurs in the report of the "liberals" regarding the guilt of political and civic leaders and police and thereifs who deliberately forment lynching campaigne against Negro workers and farmers. The organhers and agitators for every lynching that has occurred within our mem-sary in the South are known. Without exception, in cases of prinners being taken from joils and lynched, the sheriffs and joilers were accomplices, if met actual instigutors of the crimes. Yet the report says nothing about these facts. Nor done the report deal is any way with the hundreds of Symblengs that are hushed up. In all cities of the South policemen regularly heat into insensibility Negro workers in the streets and frequently inflict injuries that result in death—put these brutal hillings are not recorded as fynchings. An shilging lynch curoner reports that death occurred from "natural casses" or from "alsoholises" or some other handy lie.

Such action, combined with the crem of strong defense organizations among the workers and farmers can defeat the lynch gang.
