In Kentucky the gun thugs, multiplied in number, have increased their terrordesperate effort to crush the strike that is fast spreading indutrial paralysis over the coal fields. Not only do the coal thugs raid union a relief headquarters and arrest officials of the National Miners' Union, relief workers, newspaper writers, but they have arrested Allen Taub, attorney for the laternational Labor Defense, who went to Kentucky to defend the polasners and to secure bond for their releast. The coal operators do not want even the farce of a trial before their bought and paid for judges of the calibre of Judge Prewitt, Judge Jones and other corporation marienettee. Such trials arouse ever larger numbers of workers to fight against the terror
